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Peace

 a harmonious relationship with God, others, and creation

 a Divine Gift -- the result of living according to God's Will



Creation Story (Genesis 1:4 -2:2)

After creating light, God saw that the light was good. After gathering the waters and letting dry land appear, ... good. After creating vegetation, ... good. After creating the sun, moon, and stars, ... good. After creating living creatures in the water and the sky, ... good. After creating animals on the land, ... good. After creating male and female, God looks at all of creation and declares it very good.

"God rested on the seventh day."

Covenantal Relationship

"If you walk in my statutes and observe my commandments and do them, then I will give you your rains in their season, and the land shall yield its increase, ... And I will give peace in the land, and you shall lie down, and none shall make you afraid." (Leviticus 26:3–6)

"But if you will not listen to me, and will not do all these commandments... I will appoint over you sudden terror, consumption and fever that waste the eyes and cause life to pine away." (Leviticus 26:14, 16)

Reconciliation



restoration of ruptured relationships

- vertical: relationship with God
- horizontal: relationship with fellow human beings

Reconciliation between God and Men

- sin disrupts humanity's relationship with God
- God continuously invites His people back to Him

"Where are you?" (Genesis 3:9)

"The Lord God made garments of skins for the man and for his wife, and clothed them." (Genesis 3:21)

Reconciliation among Human Beings

Offending others is ultimately offending God

"Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight." (Psalm 51:4)

God is the source of human reconciliation

"And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life." (Genesis 45:5)

Resilience

ability to endure hardships,
not merely due to human perseverance,
but reliance on God's compassion,

His strength,

His faithfulness to His promise.

God Is Our Strength

"The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1)

God Promises Us A Future

"For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at the last he will stand upon the earth" (Job 19:25).
